## "I'M WITH YOU IN THE VALLEY"

MATTHEW 28:19-20; PSALM 23:4 (NASB)

**INSIGHT:** This morning's message is thematic. Next Sunday's message will be textual.

**TRUTH:** We have comfort in troubled times in the scriptures, because it's in scripture alone that God reveals Himself (2 Corinthians 1:3).

The truth about life from scripture:

- 1. Job 5:7
- 2. Job 14:1
- 3. Psalm 22:11
- 4. Ecclesiastes 2
- 5. John 16:33

What does God want you and me to know about these days and any days of trouble and loss and pain?

I. GOD IS IN OUR TROUBLE (Isaiah 14:24, 46:10-11; Amos 3:6; Lamentations 3:37, 38, and 39).

**INSIGHT:** None of us have any place to complain about the trouble of these days.

**INSIGHT:** In light of our sin, we have no right to complain about calamity. We have the privilege to plead for mercy, but no right to complain.

## II. THE PURPOSES OF GOD ARE HIDDEN (Matthew 23:37-38).

**INSIGHT:** The leveling of Jerusalem by the Roman army, the burning of the Temple, and the slaughter of over a million Jews was the judgment of God on a Christ-rejecting nation.

**TRUTH:** Today it's very unlikely that we know the purpose of God in the trouble of our world and lives (Isaiah 45:15).

## III. GOD TELLS US ONLY WHAT WE NEED TO KNOW.

**INSIGHT:** God reveals only what He determines we need to know (Ephesians 1:11).

**INVITATION:** So, what's the good from trouble?

**TRUTH:** Trouble tests our faith (Deuteronomy 8:2).

God is in our trouble!

- Nothing has happened apart from Him.
- His purpose in each trouble of these days is hidden.
- God is under no obligation to tell us what His purpose is or was.
- Trials strip us down to one thing that God desires above all: humility, a total submission to God (Micah 6:8).
