"Missions and the Disciple: From Exiles to Agents" Austin Holcomb, Cross-Cultural Worker

1 PETER 1:1-2:10

KEY QUESTION: Who is the agent in the mission of God?

GOD'S MISSION: To save and sanctify a people, so they might be set apart to make His name known in all the earth.

I. THE GAP BETWEEN A BROKEN WORLD AND GOD (1 Peter 1:1-12)

INSIGHT: People do not need more evidence of universal corruption and alienation from God. They experience it every day.

TRUTH: The only way to bridge this gap is the gospel of Jesus Christ.

APPLY: Can you think of someone who needs a message of hope? What prevents you from sharing this endless treasure with them this week?

II. THE GAP BETWEEN A DISCIPLE AND GOD'S POWER SUPPLY (1 Peter 1:13-25)

INSIGHT: In Scripture, there is a correlation between nearness to God and personal holiness.

TRUTH: The Holy Spirit takes up residence in every disciple of the Lord Jesus (1 Cor. 6:19-20). The work of the Holy Spirit in the disciple's life is called sanctification.

What hinders the Holy Spirit?	What does sanctification look like?

APPLY: Are you believing in the work of Christ and obeying the commands of Christ? Are you doing the basics?

III. THE GAP BETWEEN A MINISTER AND GOD'S PEOPLE (1 Peter 2:1-10)

INSIGHT: The historical distinction between clergy and laity is not biblical.

TRUTH: God's chosen agent is not just Peter, not just pastors, and not just missionaries...it's every disciple.

APPLY: Are you living as a sent agent in the mission of God? Anything less is not what God intended.
