

## "UNLIMITED MERCY" Todd Core, Student/Teaching Pastor

## **MATTHEW 18:21-35**

QUESTION POSED TO JESUS: "How many times should I forgive someone?"

**TRUTH:** The kingdom of heaven takes an extreme approach to forgiveness.

To understand Jesus' answer to this question, consider the following implications:

1. Ponder the magnitude of your own debt (vv. 23-27).

**TRUTH:** Our sin debt is utterly unpayable.

**TRUTH:** God's forgiveness eliminates our debt completely.

2. Those who receive forgiveness are expected to give forgiveness (vv. 28-30).

TRUTH: In comparison, the debts owed us are miniscule compared to the debt we have been forgiven by God.

**TRUTH:** The grace we have received is of such a magnitude that we are compelled to release our perceived rights over debts owed to us.

**INSIGHT:** When dealing with wrongs done to us, we often fail to hear the echo of our own plea for forgiveness.

3. Withholding forgiveness after experiencing it yourself leads to a hard truth (vv. 31-35).

TRUTH: Jesus calls this hypocrisy wicked.

**TRUTH:** The Father will deal justly with those who hoard mercy.

**ONE LAST REMINDER:** This is not just a parable about forgiveness but repeated forgiveness (v. 21).

## **NEXT STEPS:**

- 1. Give renewed praise to the Father for the debt He has forgiven you in Christ Jesus.
- 2. Work through the process of forgiveness with those God brought to mind during this message.
