2 Timothy 2:1-7 (NASB) ¹ You therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. ² The things which you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, entrust these to faithful people who will be able to teach others also. ³ Suffer hardship with me, as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. ⁴ No soldier in active service entangles himself in the affairs of everyday life, so that he may please the one who enlisted him. ⁵ And if someone likewise competes as an athlete, he is not crowned as victor unless he competes according to the rules. ⁶ The hard-working farmer ought to be the first to receive his share of the crops. ⁷ Consider what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in everything.

I. POWER TO INVEST IN THE NEXT

- a. Your power to invest is not tied to what you are able to do.
- b. Your power to invest must be tied to what already has been done through the work of Jesus.

TRUTH: We invest because Jesus first invested in us.

II. PHILOSOPHY FOR INVESTING IN THE NEXT

a. The philosophy behind *Invest in the Next* is the preservation of the gospel by passing it off to those who will in turn pass it off to the next generation.

III. PROCESS FOR INVESTING IN THE NEXT

a. Allow what has been invested in us to overflow into the lives of others.

IV. PRODUCT OF INVESTING IN THE NEXT

a. The product of investing in the next is warriors for the faith who battle for the hearts of men's souls.

TRUTH: The disciple making process is simply this: make disciples who make disciples.
